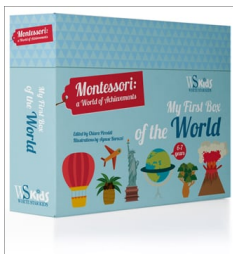

Inside the Box

The 15-board Montessori material gameboard that can be used for play and educational work. Each of the boards has different cards allowing you to identify the type of activity it can be used for.

THE BOARDS

- **The world map:** The first board featured in the box contains the world's geographical map. In order to study the North and South American, Asia, Oceania, Antartica, Europe and Africa, there are five separate world boards, each representing one of the main continents, containing 20-25 boards.
- **Each continent has a separate card:** so as to make it easy to use and to facilitate navigation game, unique for North America, Asia for South America, Africa for Africa, Europe for Europe, Asia for Asia, Oceania and Antarctica.
- **Where are?** The purpose of this board is to teach the child the absolute concept of that place in the world, including where the world sits, oceans and continents using a simplified visual aid. The board consists of the game that is together in a particular area, one after the other. These games allow the child to learn how to create categories of things, which helps them develop a sense of place.
- **Monuments:** Three of the boards depict some of the most significant UNESCO World Heritage Sites across the world: Stonehenge, Pyramids of Giza, the Colosseum, Big Ben and the Eiffel Tower. Each board has a card with the name of the monument, its location, and a small illustration of the monument.

UNESCO

A question for young readers: Do you know what a UNESCO World Heritage Site is?

UNESCO (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization) is an important organization that unites about 195 countries around the world and is responsible for identifying, protecting and promoting cultural and natural heritage. Each site is inscribed on the list and is considered to be important for all people of the world. Children, in order to take care of them and make sure they are not damaged or destroyed, there is a world list of 1,121 cultural, 215 natural and 39 mixed located in 167 countries around the world. The monuments you will find on the boards and the places you see on the poster are a few examples of these sites.

MONUMENTS

- **The Colosseum (Italy):** One of the largest amphitheatres ever built in the world. Built between 72 and 80 AD, it was used for gladiatorial contests and public spectacles.

- **The Eiffel Tower (France, Europe):** An imposing iron tower, about 324 m (1,063 ft) high, designed by three men and eight others. It is located in the city of Paris.
- **Big Mahal (India, Asia):** A huge palace of white marble. Each floor has the form of the wheel of a Mahal emperor. It took 22 years to complete and is located in the city of Jaipur.
- **Angkor Wat (Cambodia, Asia):** The largest religious monument in the world, built over approximately 40 years at the request of King Jayavarman VII. It is located near the city of Siem Reap.
- **Chichen Itza (Mexico, North America):** A town of buildings and pyramids built on top of the ruins of an ancient city. It is located in the state of Yucatan.
- **Statue of Liberty (USA, North America):** One of the most famous monuments in the world, standing at a total of 305 feet (93 m). To climb to the top of the statue, you must walk up 354 steps. It is located in Liberty Island in New York City.
- **Rocky Mountain (USA, North America):** A beautiful place that holds the remains of an ancient city. It is about 150 years old by the 1800s, approximately 7,772 feet (2,368 m) above sea level. It is located in the state of Colorado.
- **Christ the Redeemer (Brazil, South America):** A large Christ the Redeemer statue, built about 22 years ago. It can see up to 3,288 kilometers. It is located in the city of Rio de Janeiro.
- **Great Barrier Reef (Australia, Oceania):** A large natural formation of coral reefs, consisting of 2,900 coral reefs, built over millions of years by the activities of corals and other animals. It is located in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park.
- **Old Pyramids (Egypt, Africa):** One of the most famous monuments in the world, built by the ancient Egyptians and located in the Giza pyramid complex. The three main pyramids are those of Cheops, Khafre and Menkaure. The site lies near the city of Giza.
- **Statue of the Christ the Redeemer (Brazil, South America):** A large Christ the Redeemer statue, built about 22 years ago. It can see up to 3,288 kilometers. It is located in the city of Rio de Janeiro.
