For 40 years he played a key role in shaping the visual aesthetic of the magazine. Hinz has created a comprehensive and varied oeuvre and ranks among the most influential photographers worldwide. **Peter-Matthias Gaede** studied social sciences at the University of Göttingen and attended the Henri Nannen School of Journalism. He worked at the Frankfurter Rundschau newspaper before joining *GEO* magazine in 1983, serving as its Editor-in-Chief from 1994 to 2014 and as editor of a series of *GEO* spin-offs. Gaede is on the board of several organisations, including the Körber Foundation, Reporters without Borders, Germany, and UNICEF Germany.
