


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Textiles and Text

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This publication focuses on the interrelationship between archival and bibliographic research and the study of extant objects. Papers consider how such research can inform our knowledge of textiles and dress in terms of their production, consumption, dissemination and deterioration and in turn, how the study of extant objects can give added depth to this analysis. The authors include conservators, curators, historians and conservation scientists. These postprints are the third in a series of three volumes of papers published following the conferences of the AHRC (Arts and Humanities Research Council) Research Centre for Textile Conservation and Textile Studies, Textile Conservation Centre, University of the Southampton, and published by Archetype Books.
